- ✦ Children may commune with parental and pastoral permission and orientation.
- ✦ Children or adults not receiving the sacrament are invited to receive a blessing (please indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest).
- ✦ If medical or health concerns give you reason to avoid one of the elements, please remember that the Church teaches that Christ is fully present in either element alone, bread or wine.
- ✦ To receive the sacrament without coming forward, please notify an usher and be seated near an aisle.

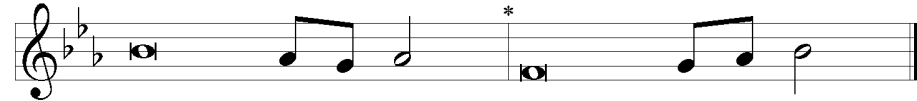

St. Matthew 22:1-14

The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew.

Glory to you, O Lord.

At that time: Again Jesus spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people, in parables, saying, ²"The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a marriage feast for his son, ³and sent his servants to call those who were invited to the marriage feast; but they would not come. ⁴Again he sent other servants, saying, "Tell those who are invited, Behold, I have made ready my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves are killed, and everything is ready; come to the marriage feast." ⁵But they made light of it and went off, one to his farm, another to his business, ⁶while the rest seized his servants, treated them shamefully, and killed them. ⁷The king was angry, and he sent his troops and destroyed those murderers and burned their city. ⁸Then he said to

his servants, "The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. ⁹Go therefore to the streets, and invite to the marriage feast as many as you find." ¹⁰And those servants went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both bad and good; so the wedding hall was filled with guests. ¹¹"But when the king came in to look at the guests, he saw there a man who had no wedding garment; ¹²and he said to him, 'Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding garment?' And he was speechless. ¹³Then the king said to the attendants, 'Bind him hand and foot, and cast him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.' ¹⁴For many are called, but few are chosen."

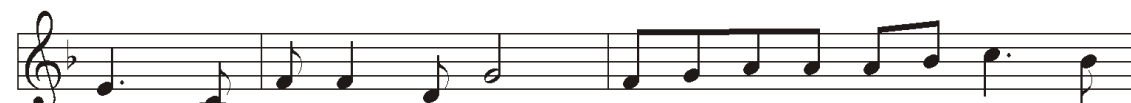



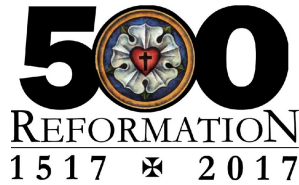
