

AN EASTER SERMON

by St. John Chrysostom,
Fifth-Century Church Father



et no one grieve over his poverty, for the universal kingdom has been revealed. Let no one weep over his sins, for pardon has shone from the grave. Let no one fear death, for the death of our Savior has set us free. He has destroyed it by enduring it. He has despoiled Hades by going down into its kingdom. He has angered it by allowing it to taste of his flesh.

"When Isaiah foresaw all

this, he cried out: 'O Hades, you have been angered by encountering Him in the nether world.' Hades is angered because it is frustrated, it is angered because it has been mocked, it is angered because it has been destroyed, it is angered because it has been reduced to naught, it is angered because it is now captive. It seized a body, and lo! it discovered God. It seized earth, and, behold! it encountered heaven. It seized the visible, and was overcome by the invisible.

"O death, where is your sting? O Hades, where is your victory? Christ is risen and life is freed! Christ is risen and the tomb is emptied of the dead! For Christ, being risen from the dead, has become the Leader and Reviver of those who had fallen asleep.

Are Not Dur Hearts Burning Within Us?

he wind whipped around the pillars of the Acropolis, perched high atop Athens' highest hill. I peered down onto Mars Hill, a knobby outcropping where St. Paul preached to the Epicurean and Stoic philosophers, revealing the identity of their unknown god.

At the time, a popular proverb claimed that there were "more gods than men" in Athens, and Paul aimed to upend this idolatrous pantheon with a powerful argument for the existence of the one, true God.

It was a variation on the "argument from design."

Today's version runs like this: The universe is too orderly, harmonious, and complex to have arisen merely by chance. Therefore, it must have been designed by an Intelligent Designer.



I admire St. Paul for tackling the philosophers on their own turf. But as I later stood on Mars Hill, gazing up at the Acropolis, I realized that the one, true God is not revealed at the pinnacle of human reason, where philosophers roam, but on the road to Emmaus, where pilgrims walk.

There, we encounter the real argument from design: *Our hearts are made to commune with the sacred heart of Jesus.* And until they do, they burn from within (Luke 24:32), yearning to behold Him.

He is the only God worth knowing, He who baptizes with the Holy Spirit and with fire (Luke 3:16). His flames can withstand the strongest gusts of human reason; they burn eternally and majestically.

Not even the stiffest pagan wind can snuff them out.

You love him. You hate him. You can't live without him. After wandering around the calendar for weeks, looking for a place to land, Blaise

Pascal is back in the house. He will be ready on April 7 to greet all those eager to make his acquaintance. He



will pack a lifetime of study into five weeks of adult Sunday school classes, starting at 9:15 a.m. in FHA.

He will also teach us about the grandeur and misery of the human condition, the reasons of the heart that reason does not know, the experiential foundation of theology, and the controversy of wagering that God exists. Books for the class are still available for \$10, as are free handouts. Both can be found in the church office.

Pascal will reveal much of the history of his short, sickly life, and nearly all his passion for defending the Christian faith against the cultured despisers of religion in17th-century France. Not surprisingly, his arguments hold up against today's new atheists, secular skeptics, and the all-around religious bullies who can't tell a philosophical argument from a hole in the ground.

Arlice Davenport will assist Pascal behind the lectern. Hope to see you there.

he way **Jim Howard** tells it, tongue in cheek, "I couldn't keep a job."

Couldn't keep it or couldn't pass up an opportunity. His jobs included Kansas Air National Guardsman, computer guru for several major companies, Sheriff's deputy, homicide detective, private investigator and aircraft mechanic, among others.

When an opportunity presented itself, he took it and was usually successful in whatever he did. "I think I've led a most interesting life."

Carol Howard has had her share of interesting jobs, too: writing and editing at a private school, school teacher at the U.S. Navy Air Facility in the Aleutian Islands, corporate secretary at Goldsmith's in Wichita, a university instructor, and an associate in Boeing's human resources for 25 years.

Happenstance at a Christmas party in Wichita in 1985 led to a mutual discovery. "We found out we both had something in common," said Jim, "poetry." But it was 10 years later before they married.

Both of them received master's degrees in management information systems from Friends University. For Carol, working on her degree also meant raising their kids, working full-time and helping redo their College Hill house. Between them they have five children from previous marriages and four grandchildren. Both retired in 2013.

Their pastimes include traveling, photography and fly fishing. But it's their faith that keeps them grounded and guides them. "It keeps me on the right path," said Carol. "(Pastor) has very good sermons that relate to what's going on in everybody's lives. It gives me something to think about every week."

The church and its message "puts me in a good space," said Jim. "It helps me understand what I need to do to contribute to the world. How it manifests itself is: Can I help you?"

They joined Gloria Dei in part because of the church's sense of community. "Every person there seems to be doing something for the church," he said.

Friendship is a theme of both novels in this month's selection of new books.


When 20-year-old nursing student Frances "Frankie"

McGrath hears the words "Women can be horoes" it comes as a revelation to her. Raised in a sheltered conservative Southern California family, she takes pride in always doing the right thing. But it is 1965, and when her brother ships out to Vietnam, she joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows his path. Overwhelmed by the chaos and destruction of war, she and her veteran friends come



home to a changed and divided America filled with protests and anger.

In *The Women: A Novel,* author Kristin Hannah tells a story that is both intimate and epic in scope, following Frankie McGrath's journey through a difficult and dangerous time, shining a light on all women whose sacrifice, courage, and patriotism are too frequently forgotten. In Remarkably Bright Creatures, author Shelby Van Pelt tells the remarkable story of Tova Sullivan, a grieving widow who works the night shift cleaning the Sowell Bay Aquarium where she makes the acquaintance of a curmudgeonly giant Pacific octopus named Marcellus. Indifferent to most humans, Marcellus forms a remarkable friendship with Tova, realiz-

ing that part of her grief is for a teen-aged son who mysteriously vanished on a boat in Puget Sound more than 30




