Regarding the Lord's Supper (also known as Holy Communion, the Mass, or the Eucharist) :

- + The Sacrament is open to all baptized persons who are able to receive the Sacrament in their home church.
- + We confess that in the Sacrament we receive the true Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, for the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation.
- + Communion is received by common cup or intinction: you may drink from the first chalice or dip the host in the second chalice.
- + If medical or health concerns give you reason to avoid one of the elements, please remember that Christ is fully present in either element alone, bread or wine.
- + Children may commune with parental and pastoral permission and orientation.
- + Children or adults not receiving the Sacrament are invited to receive a blessing (please indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest).
- + To receive the sacrament without coming forward, please notify an usher and be seated near an aisle.

Prayer of the Week: Almighty God, you fulfill the promise of Easter by sending your Holy Spirit to unite the races and nations on Earth and thus to proclaim your glory. May your Spirit come to rest in our hearts and heal the divisions of word and tongue, that with one voice and one song we may priase your name in joy and thanksgiving; through Jesus Christ our Lord. 





NICENE CREED
